Over time more and more visitors wanted to explore the area's spectacular scenery and history associations therefore we took this opportunity to set up daily sightseeing tours covering all four corners of the Lake District.

The creamery is home to Wensleydale Cheese the personal favourite of Wallace and Gromit, plenty of opportunity to sample it yourself. We complete our journey back to Windermere via Kirkby Lonsdale.

York Tours



Head into the North York Moors National Park where you will explore the beautiful landscapes and historical sites before heading to the coast, this tour is a day to make memories you will never forget.

Our first stop of the tour is Pickering, a ancient market-town on the border of the North York Moors national park. Here you can enjoy tea or coffee while meandering around the quaint town, there will also be an option to visit the church, famous for having the oldest wall paintings in England inside. From Pickering we travel into the national park itself, famed for the stunning views of heather moorland which, on a clear day, can extend for 50 miles in every direction. When the heather blooms the landscape is painted deep purple, showcasing the natural beauty of the rolling hills!

We stop next in Goathland, famous for its role in the TV series Heartbeat. Here you will have a brief stop where you can see Goathland Station, which featured in the world-renowned Harry Potter movies as Hogsmead. Next we arrive in Whitby for lunch, a traditional seaside town, where there is a wide choice of places to eat with fish and chips being the local favourite. There are a number of things to see and do such as visiting the dramatic ruins of Whitby Abbey, which was the inspiration for the novel 'Dracula' or even taking a stroll along the harbour with its quaint shops. Please note, Whitby Abbey is closed Mondays & Tuesdays throughout the winter from November – February.

After our lunch stop it is time to travel through the heart of the moors, following roads through the stunning expanse of heather moorland you will be treated to the wealth of knowledge our local driver guides possess. Learn about the ancient traditions, folklores and legends which have been passed down through generations. Listen to tall tales and stories from the national parks past and learn about the natural history of the beautiful landscapes.

There will be a short stop in Helmsley where you can explore the village and you will have the option to visit castle ruins for an additional charge. We will then make our way back towards York whilst enjoying the views over the Vale of York. Sit back and enjoy more scenic Yorkshire countryside as your memorable tour draws to a close.

Itinerary

Escape the crowded streets of York for a full-day sightseeing tour of the Yorkshire Dales and discover one of England's most dramatic landscapes. Departing York at 09:15 the tour heads to the Yorkshire Dales national park, well known for its beautiful rolling hills and lazy rivers which flow down the dales (or valleys). Enjoy a day touring "God's own country", which Yorkshire is often called because of its natural beauty and unspoilt countryside but don't just take our word for it – come and see for yourself.

First stop will be in the market town of Masham in Lower Wensleydale. Famous for its family-run breweries, steam engines, and annual sheep fair, it's thriving market (Wednesdays and Saturdays) is still going strong 762 years since the 1st charter. Continue towards Middleham, nestled between 2 rivers. Travel through the gently sloping Dales towards Castle Bolton, where you will see some of the best scenery Yorkshire has to offer. Pause to look at its magnificent castle with the largest castle keep in the North of England.

Admire one of Britain's best-preserved medieval castles at Castle Bolton, built by Sir Richard Le Scrope to rival the most luxurious homes in the land. See the scars of its 600-year history, including its involvement in the Pilgrimage of Grace, Mary Queen of Scot's imprisonment, and a Civil War siege. Afterwards we continue the journey through the stunning landscapes of Yorkshire traveling towards Aysgarth Falls on the River Ure. Here you will have the chance to view the famous waterfalls, which drops over three major falls in less than one mile. An amazingly scenic stop, the falls are a showcase of the beauty of nature and were also the settling for a famous scene in the Hollywood film Robin Hood Prince of Thieves. The three stepped waterfall has been a firm favourite with tourists for over 200 years. It's said that William Wordsworth and his sister Dorothy visited the falls while they waited for their coach horses.

For lunch we head to the charming market-town of Hawes. Nestled in Upper Wensleydale in North Yorkshire this beautiful place is surrounded with scenery the Yorkshire Dales is famous for. It is simple beautiful. Travel over the Buttertubs pass which connects Hawes and the hamlet of Thwaite with spectacular views over the surrounding valleys and fells. In recent days, the pass was featured as the second King of the Mountains climb of the 2014 Grand Depart of the Tour de France.

Hawes is also home to the Wensleydale Creamery, famous for its array of cheeses which are much loved by fictional, animated characters, Wallace, and Gromit. Hawes marketplace was first recorded in 1307 and still has a lively market every Tuesday. Enjoy the delights of Wensleydale Creamery including the visitors centre and cheese tasting room. Explore the creamery and have a taste of the real Dales in their sample room. There is plenty of time to shop for your favourite cheeses and marvel at the beautiful surroundings the creamery sits within.

Finally, we will follow the Dales scenic route back to the medieval city of York, driving through picturesque villages and classic Dales villages, with stops along the way so you can photograph the memorable landscapes which you will treasure forever.

Manchester, Liverpool & Chester Tours



Itinerary

This tour gives you a day in North Wales including the Snowdonia National Park, from Manchester. It's an ideal way to see the amazing landscape associated with this stunning part of Wales and the National Park.

The first stop is Conwy, famous for its medieval castle, Conwy Castle, which was built by Edward I in the 13th century. The castle is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and is considered one of the finest examples of medieval military architecture in Europe. It offers visitors a glimpse into the past with its well-preserved walls, towers, and views of the town and surrounding area. In addition to the castle, Conwy is also home to other historical landmarks such as the Conwy Town Walls, which encircle the town and provide a scenic walkway for visitors. The town itself features narrow streets lined with traditional buildings, including the iconic Plas Mawr, a beautifully restored Elizabethan townhouse. Conwy is also known for its vibrant cultural scene, with various festivals and events taking place throughout the year. The town offers a range of attractions, including art galleries, museums, and a bustling harbour where visitors can enjoy boat trips and water sports. With its

combination of history, natural beauty, and cultural offerings, Conwy attracts tourists from around the world who come to explore its heritage and enjoy its charming atmosphere.

The next stop is to the heart of the Welsh industry, at the <u>National Slate Museum</u>, the museum is located in a Victorian workshop built at the base of Elidir mountain. Enjoy the talk and demonstration on offer at the museum, which show the skills of the quarryman. View a slate-splitting demonstration from craftsman's and quarry workers. From here you will join the <u>Llanberis Lake Railway</u> which is a steam engine train which travels a five mile return journey along Lake Padarn, in the heart of Snowdonia. *Please note the train ride is only included March – November*.

Betws-y-coed is one of the main honeypot locations in the Snowdonia national park. Snowdonia National Park was the third national park in Britain, after the Peak and Lake district parks. It covers 827 square miles and has 37 miles of coastline. There are plenty of arts and crafts shops, places for lunch. Give them an hour here. Betws-y-coed is sometimes referred to as the gateway to Snowdonia, and is a popular base for climbers, walkers, and cyclists. Originally, the village served as a resting place for travelers and pilgrims on their way to the nearby monastery of Ynys Enlli (Bardsey Island). The name "Betws-y-Coed" translates to "Prayer House in the Wood" in English, reflecting its historical connection to religious pilgrimage.

During the 19th century, Betws-y-Coed experienced significant growth and development due to the rise of tourism. The opening of the railway in 1868 played a crucial role in attracting visitors to the area, as it provided easier access for tourists from major cities.
